

A warm welcome to each of you as we gather for worship today and a special welcome to our guests. As we offer God our praise, may you be richly blessed by God's gracious Word, Meal and community.

HAVEN IS WORKING TO PROTECT EVERYONE'S HEALTH AS WE WORSHIP

***The air in Haven's sanctuary is circulated through our new ionizing system 24/7.** This system is the same used in airplanes and doctor's offices to combat airborne particulates that carry bacteria and viruses including COVID.

***Hand sanitizing** stations and **masks** are available at both entrances.

***Hand sanitizer** is available in every pew.

***There is an area of chairs for those who wish to practice social distancing** in the back of the center portion of the church.

***Communion can be brought to anyone** who would prefer not to come into the center of the congregation.

Pass on the word that Haven is a good place to worship, with safeguards in place to combat COVID during these challenging times.

Special Worship Notes and Precautions

With Washington County still designated as an area of high COVID transmission, the Maryland Department of Health and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention strongly recommend but do not require that vaccinated persons wear masks during indoor gatherings. At Haven, vaccinated persons are welcome to wear a mask at worship, for their own protection or the protection of elders, immune-compromised, children, and the unvaccinated.

At this time, as we continue to be mindful and caring for one another, please:

- use provided hand sanitizer as much as possible (as you enter & leave the building & in the pews);
- pass the peace from your seat for now. (A wave, bow or fist bump are the safest. Include a wave to those participating at home. Use hand sanitizer if you do exchange a hand shake.)
- As you come forward for communion, please leave some space between yourself and any persons in front of you who are from another household.
- Like Jesus, we strive to invite, welcome and include everyone. Thus, practicing good hospitality, PLEASE do not ask or quiz persons about their mask choice OR their vaccination status. Wearing a mask or not, we worship our Lord together with gratitude and joy.
- If you are feeling poorly or have a temperature, please join worship on-line until you are feeling better. Call the church if you'd like to be added to the prayer list or speak with the pastor.

*For those communing in the church: Holy Communion will be offered in bread and wine. Grape juice is also available. As your section comes forward, **please leave room between yourself and those in front of you who are from another household.***

First come to the pastor to receive the bread dropped into your hand. Step to the side and consume the host. Second, go to the assisting minister to take a cup of wine or grape juice. 
