WELCOME HOME. YOU BELONG

For seventeen centuries or so, the weeks before Easter have been ones of intentional preparation for Christians. For many of those years it primarily involved those readying to be baptized at Easter. But for more years now, Lent is a special time for *all the baptized* to open their lives and alter their

habits in order to return to God's presence and renew that most essential relationship. Lent, in a very real sense, is "coming home" to our Lord's waiting and welcoming embrace.

You will be seeing copies of Rembrandt's painting *Return of the Prodigal Son* at Haven. Notice the son kneeling with worn shoes and tattered clothing whose head now rests on his father's heart. Notice the father's hands holding his son with strength and tenderness, too. A warm gold seems to surround them. It's a picture of homecoming, a child and parent reunion, the broken and lost finding a safe place in love's extravagant acceptance. That's Lent — coming home again to be with the One who loves us boundlessly.

But you will also notice in that Rembrandt painting those who are watching this reunion. Each bystander has their own story and perhaps each an opinion of this father-son reunion. There may be times when we realize we have become spectators rather than participants in our faith lives. Times when it dawns upon you that you have come to talk *about* God but not *with* God or go through the motions, but your heart is unmoved. Lent calls you out of the shadows into your own reunion with the Lord who yearns to love you and draw you into an embrace called "home."

We enter into the third Lenten season since COVID became a part of our world. During these incredibly stressful and roller-coaster months, there are times when we may have wondered, “Where are you God?” With limited and on-line interactions, we struggle to feel connected, maybe even to our Lord. Into this particular year, Lent can be our place to re-open our weary eyes, ears and hearts to God’s eternal and welcoming presence that never vanishes and is never severed, even when we may not feel or sense it. Maybe this Lent will be a time to reclaim a belief in God’s goodness and faithfulness that is the “home” to which we are always welcome and belong.

Lent starts on Ash Wednesday, March 2nd. Read in this month’s newsletter and upcoming Sunday bulletins about opportunities and possibilities to make this Lenten season meaningful and rich. It’s a forty-day (plus Sundays) journey that some might call old fashioned or outdated. But I figure you can either stand on the sidelines critiquing or you can dare to come before our gracious God and see what happens when we let God love us. Choose life. Come home this Lent. You Belong.



LENT 2022 – WELCOME. You are Loved. You Belong!

Lent begins **Ash Wednesday, March 2**. It is the church season in which we try to draw closer to our Lord of boundless grace and welcome. It is a time when we respond with trust to God's unfailing love, so we can "come clean" and re-choose pathways to a fuller love of God and neighbor. During this year's Lenten adventure, we are invited to hear the Lord say to us, "Welcome. You Belong."

Available tools for your Lenten journey:

- 1) Grace Abounded – a devotional booklet with a reading, brief reflection and prayer for each day of Lent. Suitable for adults and teens.
- 2) Welcome. You Belong key tags – a daily reminder that you are a child of God and you belong to God and God's family. You can also use it to let others know God and Haven also say to them "You are Welcome. You Belong."
- 3) Return of the Prodigal Son book and bible study (see the article below for more details).
- 4) Midweek Lenten Worship, 7 p.m. See below

LENTEN MIDWEEK WORSHIP

Welcome Home. You are loved. You belong.

It has long been a custom among many Christian churches to gather for mid-week worship and programs during Lent. It is yet one way to participate in this holy season of spiritual renewal. By setting aside this time each week —

“interrupting” your regular schedule — you place a “post-it” note on your calendar, a reminder that your relationship with the Lord is indeed important to you.

The liturgy (order of worship) we use is the lovely Holden Evening Prayer. A brief reflection on the divine attributes from the previous Sunday’s gospel texts: Faithfulness, Mercy, Compassion, Forgiveness and Love. We hope you leave in the wonder of God’s peace.

Write “I love you Lord” on the Wednesdays of Lent in your planner and come savor God’s love for you.

My dear, dear member, friends and guest of Haven,

YES, you did it! I was totally surprised on Sunday, February 20, 2022 when you celebrated my 15 years at Haven.



Mary Grabill made sure I had a bulletin that did not mention the flower dedication or any other note that might give it away. As I scurried around the narthex that morning, there were folks stealthily making sure I noticed nothing out of place, and I didn't see anything unusual. I did notice some unexpected guests, but I conjured ideas to explain each of their presence. Your love, kindness and generosity overwhelm me. And it is not just on special occasions, but continuously. You are very good at expressing your appreciation and gratitude to me. I am humbled, blessed and encouraged by it. YOU are "God sightings" to me.



As I tried not to keep you too long on Sunday, I did not fully unpack the amazing gifts you gave me. I showed you the beautiful box with the commissioned tile of Haven. (I'll be sure to put it out again next week, so you can see it up close if you didn't get the opportunity to do so. It is beautiful.) Later I discovered that your gift box also contained other gifts you may not have known about: a \$50 gift card from Dunkin' Donuts, \$50 gift card to Los Amigos restaurant, a \$50 gift card to the Brewhouse restaurant, a \$120 certificate to the Bodyworks Massage Center and a certificate telling me that a donation had been given to the ELCA Disaster Relief Fund for Tornado Relief work. *All* of that plus a VERY generous \$1,000 check. What a bounty! It literally took my breath away.

Later in the day when I sat and read your cards and notes, my heart just overflowed. I lifted each of you up in prayer. I cannot express how deeply meaningful and fortifying that is to hear. I do hope I offer you similar encouragement. 
