As we peeked around the corner of COVID in March, we stepped into the Lenten season, cautious but hopeful. We dream about Spring and getting yards and gardens ready as we have some warm temperatures in early March. Look, some of the flowers are sprouting.

Just when we imagine things are seeming a bit more “normal,” it SNOWS on March 12. It was almost shocking. Snow had been predicted for Hagerstown so many times this past winter and didn't show up. But this time it did. We had to cancel the planned Council Retreat. We had to dig out our shovels so we could dig out our cars and sidewalks. It was still a bit icy Sunday morning.

Maybe I should be surprised that I was surprised. Little has seemed predictable or certain in these last two years. Just when it seems COVID is going to stop being the top story in the news, Ukraine is invaded and continuously bombed. Just when we think Spring is here, snow arrives. Now, that can all sound very dire and pessimistic but that is not my direction.



There are always surprises, whether we carefully plan or don't. Yet have you noticed that it is often the unplanned snafus that become the stories everyone loves to remember from a wedding, holiday or vacation. (“Remember when...”) I saw snow but Tanner Meredith saw opportunity. Some called the snow an



inconvenience. Yet, when people walked or drove by the imprint of a snow angel, they smiled at the fun or thought of making snow angels themselves a time ago.

Then there is that ultimate of surprise. They go to the tomb to properly attend to Jesus' body and the women find the tomb empty. They are told to “go tell.” Later, Jesus

himself appears to the disciples --- resurrected from the dead, with his recognizable scars, yet never to die again. How can it be? Literally, God only knows, and we cannot explain it with the limits of our human knowledge. What we can do, is believe in the resurrection as we trust in the power, goodness and promises of the God who calls us "Beloved."

While we grieve the pain of our brothers and sisters in Ukraine and other places in the nation and world.... as we wonder if the next variant will be so harmful.... As we hope the flowers, bud and crops that poked out in the warmth will not be damaged by the cold that still visits...SURPRISE! God is the master of bringing light into darkness, peace to troubled hearts and even life out of death, not only on Easter but always. So, we pray: Give us eyes to see; hearts open to receive; the deep desire to "go tell;" and renewed and renewing lives that overflow with the hope of the resurrection and the love of God.



WEDNESDAY, APRIL 13 PRAYER VIGIL

7 am – 7 pm

Set aside an hour with the Lord.

A prayer vigil is an intentional and watchful time set apart for the purpose of prayer. We at Haven are setting apart 12 hours during Holy Week for individuals or groups to sit with our Lord.



During that time, you are invited to pray for those concerns and persons for which members of our congregation have requested prayer. Those prayer requests will be available on cards in the church. You can take a few, lift them up in prayer in whatever way you wish, and then return them to a second basket. You can continue taking prayer request cards, praying and re-turning for new requests as often as you wish during your time.

You may also choose during your vigil time to simply sit in the quiet to listen to the Lord or read and meditate on Bible passages or hymns. You may pray while sitting, kneeling or walking around the sanctuary. Whatever you find meaningful is good.

During the vigil, we will have printed instructions for praying with the Prayer Request cards. We will provide a prayer to use at the beginning and end of your vigil time. We will also provide Bible verses and hymns for use as devotions or for meditation. You may bring your own material for your time with the Lord. Our GOAL is to have SOMEONE in Haven's sanctuary during EACH HOUR of the vigil. We will post a schedule for the vigil hours and ask you to sign up to be in the church for a half hour or one hour. You may sign up alone or with a friend, family or group.

If you've never participated in a vigil, you will find the time goes much more quickly than you imagined. You will find it incredibly meaningful to know you are supporting others with prayer for the concern of their hearts. Let us set aside time to rest in the Lord this Wednesday of Lent and fill Haven's sanctuary with our prayers to the Lord who promises to hear and care.



THURSDAY, APRIL 14 ~ MAUNDY THURSDAY
12:00 noon Worship with Holy Communion
5:30 - 7:30 pm "Agape" Meal and Worship

The Agape ("Love") Feast dates to apostolic times when Christians gather to "feast" on God's Word, a simple meal fellowship and the Holy Eucharist.



Following in this ancient tradition, our **evening Maundy Thursday worship** will be an Agape Meal and Service (in the parlor) that will conclude with the stripping of the altar (church sanctuary) in preparation for Good Friday. We'll begin by gathering at tables in the parlor, praying and listening to God's Word together before we share a simple meal of soup, bread, cheese and fruit. After eating, we will continue our worship by sharing the Lord's Supper with bread and wine at each table. We'll conclude with a procession across the narthex to the darkened church sanctuary to watch the altar and sanctuary being stripped in preparation for Good Friday as Psalm 22 is chanted.

Our Worship Team hopes this Maundy Thursday "Agape" Meal and Worship will be a meaningful way to mark this day of Holy Week.

So, we can have enough tables and food prepared, we ask that you sign up to attend on the attendance form in the Sunday bulletin or by calling the church office no later than April 10. If you have any questions, please contact Pastor Alessandri.

The Tenebrae Service is a traditional Good Friday service of Light and Word commemorating the Passion and Death of our Lord. As we move through the events leading to the crucifixion, we extinguish candles, letting the darkness of the betrayal, abuse and abandonment Jesus experienced surround us. Be ready to be moved. Be ready to leave marveling at the depth of the Lord's love for us. Be ready to walk into Easter with deeper appreciation.

A NEW HOLY WEEK WORSHIP OPPORTUNITY
An Easter Vigil, April 16 8:00 pm
Trinity Lutheran Church (Hagerstown)

We all love Christmas Eve. While most of us have given up on having worship beginning at 11pm, that service is actually the vigil of Christmas. Vigil means to “keep watch and pray as we wait for something to happen.” In this case we are waiting for the dawn of Christmas Day when we welcome the Baby Jesus into our midst.

Traditionally, one of the most important services in the life of the Church is the vigil of Easter. It, too, is to begin at 11pm so the liturgy takes us past midnight when we celebrate the first Eucharist of the resurrection of our Lord. Unfortunately, in our tradition, the Easter Vigil does not receive the attention it deserves!

Trinity and Haven Lutheran will celebrate the Great Vigil of Easter on Holy Saturday beginning at 8pm. We gather outside the doors to Trinity’s Memorial Hall (far right side of the front of the building). There we kindle a “new fire” and with it, light the Pascal Candle which then represents the presence of Jesus amongst us. We place the date on the candle. We remember that Christ is the Alpha and Omega, the first and last of all things. We bless the candle with incense. We light individual candles from the Paschal Candle and process into Memorial Hall. The doors to All Saints’ Chapel are closed. The celebrant bangs on the doors three time while saying, “O tomb, open now your doors.” We enter

the darkened chapel.

Then follows the *Exsultet*. This powerful, chanted blessing includes references to God leading God's people out of bondage in Egypt into the freedom of the Promised Land. The Passover figures prominently in this narrative. A favorite line in the *Exsultet* thanks the "worker bees who gave us the wax to make the candle." The candle must be at least 50% real wax. At one-point candles in the worship space are lit. With the conclusion of the *Exsultet* we extinguish our individual candles, and the chapel is partially illuminated.

NEW COMMUNION TRAYS

It was noticed that the communion cups were getting stuck in the wooden trays more frequently. The Altar Guild proposed we look into replacing them with new trays. The search uncovered trays that were easily cleaned and coordinated with the copper coloring of the other metal furnishings in the sanctuary.



With Council's approval, six trays, a communion tray base and a lid were ordered. Since we knew the lid was caught in one of those supply chain disruptions, we ordered one more tray than we thought necessary to act as a cover for the filled trays in the interim.

We express our gratitude to Kristen, Don and Abigail Andrews for designating the memorial funds for Kathryn Bond (mother and grandmother) to pay for the new communion ware. On March 20th, during worship, we dedicated the communion trays to the glory of the Lord in memory of Kathryn (Kay) Bond, who was one of Haven's charter/founding members. We give thanks for these new trays that will bless our sharing of God's gift of Holy Communion for many years to come.


